MANAGEMENT

DIRECTOR OF SUPPLY CHAIN (PURCHASING & DISTRIBUTION) - POSITION CODE 3701

Responsible for leadership of the Supply Chain function or several specific functional areas, in a larger organization. (Often a second level manager.) Duties may include:

- Developing Supply Chain strategies that align with company values and goals (from customer service to successful
 operational execution).
- Management and coordination of the flow of materials and equipment from acquisition to disposition.
- Management, development and implementation of all (or several) of the following programs: maintenance of centralized purchasing, stores, and distribution programs and procedures.
- Preparation, monitoring, and administration of the annual operating and capital equipment budget including containing and minimizing the direct and indirect costs of the purchasing function.
- Management and supervision of department staff.

Post-secondary degree relating to purchasing management/administration plus P.Log. and/or PMAC certification and significant purchasing experience.

GENERAL MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3702

Responsible for managing all operational execution and overall administration of all office, warehousing, administrative and financial services (within a specific location or region) to targeted performance standards. Duties may include:

- Development of customer service process improvements.
- Issue resolution identified from logistics forecasting, modeling, and inventory projections.
- Directs purchasing, inventory and quality control processes.
- Oversees import and export processes.
- Managing to labour standards, handling industrial relations and administration standards.
- Determines Identifies outsourcing opportunities and vendor selection criteria.
- Management and supervision of staff and budget (with P&L responsibility).

Typically has a post-secondary education in Business (or equivalent) with 7+ years of related experience. Has a broad knowledge of warehousing and distribution processes, operational business issue resolution.

VP MANUFACTURING - POSITION CODE 3703

Formulates and recommends manufacturing policies to maintain or improve the profitability of production operations. Duties may include:

- Contributes to business direction, typically as a member of the executive team.
- Develops and implements manufacturing strategy, including associated programs, policies and procedures for manufacturing operations.
- Responsible for the financial performance of manufacturing operations.
- Investigates and implements new methods/technologies that will increase the cost effectiveness of manufacturing operations.
- Supervises and directs resources in areas such as production, materials management, quality control, and plant maintenance.
- Interfaces with cross-functional groups (e.g., Sales, Marketing, Engineering) to ensure timely and accurate exchange of information and expectations regarding product design, manufacturability and production schedules.

Typically has a business or engineering degree. Has significant line plant management and technical business experience.



VP OPERATIONS - POSITION CODE 3704

Responsible for one or more operational units or facilities. Duties may include:

- Plans, develops and implements operational strategies in the context of overall organizational strategy.
- Responsible for the financial performance of the facility.
- Develops policies for line operational area; plans, directs and assists departmental staff in achieving operational results.
- Recommends, monitors and reports on results against budgetary and performance measures.
- Advises on the introduction of new processes, equipment, and products to improve operational effectiveness.
- Establishes workplace climate and ensures unit is resourced to achieve objectives.

Post-secondary degree with significant line area management experience.

DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION - POSITION CODE 3706

Responsibility for overall management of all industry transportation and distribution services, and leading all operational execution including development of customer service process improvements. Duties may include:

- Reviews and actions issues relating to logistics forecasting, modeling, and inventory projections.
- Directs delivery of domestic and international customer shipment and carrier relations processes.
- Determines additional key vendor relationships (carriers, suppliers and customs brokers).
- Negotiates vendor contracts and determines acceptable service agreement standards.
- Decides on transportation outsourcing opportunities and vendor selection criteria.
- Develops transportation metrics and monitors against targeted performance standards.
- Management and supervision of department staff and budget.

Typically has post-secondary education in Business (or equivalent), completion of several P. Log. Modules, with 10+ years related experience. Has a broad knowledge of business issues and processes such as Transportation and Distribution Management, and effective warehouse practices.

DIRECTOR LOSS PREVENTION / RISK MANAGEMENT - POSITION CODE 3765

Responsible for minimizing loss of products and maximizing security, transportation and warehousing processes, product profitability, and insurance requirements (for a single location or region). Duties may include:

- Defines metrics to measure, analyze, improve and control exposure.
- Developing packaging, storage, shipping strategies to minimize product spoilage.
- Determines and monitors security processes to ensure minimal opportunity for product loss or pilfering.
- Reviews and manages general liability insurance, operating risk, and property, casualty and product liability insurance.
- Maintains on-going client relationships with key clients to ensure delivery deadlines are not impacted by loss prevention processes.
- May have responsibility for safety procedures and managing safety to regulated standards.
- Management and supervision of staff and budget.

Typically has post-secondary education in Business (or equivalent) with 10+ year's related experience. Has a broad knowledge of business issues and processes such as Warehouse Management, Risk Management, or

Highway/Transportation May also hold certificates in on or more of the following: WHMIS, Transportation of Dangerous Goods, or H2S.



PROCUREMENT

DIRECTOR PROCUREMENT - POSITION CODE 3707

Responsible for the development, implementation, and maintenance of centralized purchasing supplier performance, and inventory management procedures. Duties may include:

- Directs the management and coordination of the flow of materials and equipment from acquisition to disposition.
- Develops strategic plan, and policies for the operation of procurement activities.
- Directs the bid, contract negotiation, and service contract processes.
- Providing leadership and guidance on developing and maintaining long-term agreements or contracts with suppliers.
- Designing and managing a process to evaluate supplier quotations using appropriate negotiation and purchasing techniques that will ensure quality, price, delivery and after sales service.
- Designing, implementing and managing a Vendor Performance program.
- Preparation, monitoring, and administration of the annual operating and capital budget.
- Management and supervision of department staff and budget.

Post-secondary degree relating to purchasing management/administration plus P.Log. and PMAC certification and significant (12+ years) purchasing and or distribution experience.

PROCUREMENT MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3705

Responsible for the development, implementation, and maintenance of centralized purchasing supplier performance, and inventory management procedures. Duties may include:

- Management and coordination of the flow of materials and equipment from acquisition to disposition.
- Analysis of product, supply and value chains.
- Analysis and management of product life cycle.
- Manages the bid, contract negotiation, and service contract processes.
- Develops and maintains long-term agreements or contracts with suppliers.
- Establishing processes for continuous supplier development.
- Preparation, monitoring, and administration of the annual operating and capital budget for department.
- Management and supervision of department staff and budget.

Post-secondary degree relating to purchasing management/administration plus P.Log. and PMAC certification and significant (10+ years) purchasing and or distribution experience.

BUYER LEAD (SUPERVISOR) - POSITION CODE 3709

Responsible for managing other Buyers, and initiating large purchase orders. Duties may include:

- Developing key vendor criteria and vendor selection, and relationship management.
- Managing partnerships and alliances, and relationship management.
- Monitors the bid, contract negotiation, and service contract processes.
- Manages very large or highly complex procurement projects.
- Leadership of other less experienced buyers.
- Monitors sales and approves major Purchase Orders.
- Market analysis or competitive commodity price reviews.

Post-secondary degree plus P.Log. and PMAC with 10+ years of purchasing experience.

BUYER LEVEL 3 - POSITION CODE 3708

Senior Level. Responsible for purchasing of specialized items requiring extensive knowledge and experience in specialty areas. Duties may include:

- Determines purchase requirements for a large portfolio of accounts by reviewing inventories and purchase requests Managing partnerships and alliances within client group.
- Leads the bid, contract negotiation, and service contract processes for client area.
- Manages more complex/technical procurement projects.
- Monitors sales and approves major Purchase Orders.
- Market analysis or competitive commodity price reviews.

Post-secondary degree plus PMAC with 6+ years of purchasing experience.



BUYER 2 - POSITION CODE 3711

Working Level. Responsible for purchasing a variety of items requiring knowledge of specific processes and equipment. Duties may include:

- Coordination of specific buying needs through direct contact with company departments.
- Provides specifications for items requested by departments.
- Designs and maintains appropriate records for efficient operations.
- May provide supervision to junior level buyers and clerical support.

FLEET MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3797

Responsible for the comprehensive inspection, maintenance, repair, and budget of the organization's vehicle fleet. Duties may include:

Junior Level. Performs routine and/or simple clerical work in the receipt and issuance of items, materials, and commodities. Duties may include:

- Marking or coding items for inventory control purposes.
- Maintenance of inventory control records system.
- Issues materials according to procedures.

WAREHOUSE SUPERVISOR - POSITION CODE 3717

Responsible for managing the warehouse operations on a day-to-day basis. Duties may include:

- May also assess stock supply and update inventory records.
- Communicating with internal and external customers and vendors regarding orders and shipping delays.

High school graduation with limited materials handling experience. May require forklift training. Possesses basic PC skills and keyboarding techniques. Good communication skills.



STOCK HANDLER 2 - POSITION CODE 3726

Senior Level - Responsible for the physical distribution process of shipping and receiving goods, spill and damage control and some inventory control. Duties may include:

- Loading and unloading, per request via forklift, mechanical selection, stock locator systems, palletized loads, or rack loading.
- Stocking, sorting supplies or products into storage areas or inventory bins.
- Assessing stock supply and updating inventory records.
- Restocking packing machines. May repair or document packing equipment repairs.
- Communicates with internal and external customers and vendors to resolve problems while troubleshooting and expediting replenishments.
- Responds to spills.
- Participates in safety/ergonomic recommendations and programs.
- May provide advice regarding improvements to physical distribution and inventory control.

FORKLIFT OPERATOR - POSITION CODE 3728

Responsible for moving materials to designated areas with the use of a forklift. Duties may include:

- Delivers materials to specific areas in a safe and accurate manner.
- Unloading/loading of trucks and other vehicles.
- Packing and unpacking of materials following client specifications.
- Labels products as required.
- Ensures product is damage free.

High school diploma. 1 - 3 years forklift experience with Forklift and/or power pallet jack certification. Driver's license. WHMIS certificate.

ORDER PICKER - POSITION CODE 3724

Responsible for the physical distribution process of shipping and receiving goods. Duties may include:

- Filling orders, picking products, preparing, packing or palletizing for shipment or transfer to domestic/international destinations.
- Loading and unloading, per request via mechanical selection, or by hand.
- Stocking, sorting supplies or products into storage areas or inventory bins.
- Restocking packing machines.

High school graduation with limited experience in handling materials. Ability to perform physical labour.

SHIPPING AND RECEIVING SUPERVISOR - POSITION CODE 3718 (REVISED) (REVISED TITLE)

Supervisor Level. Responsible for all shipping and receiving operations. Duties may include:

- Supervises all shipping & receiving staff.
- Supervision of computer input, preparation of required paperwork and ASN's.
- Maintains detailed records of the material flow through the department.
- Ensures the accuracy of labels and of invoicing for materials.
- Maintains records of damaged or defective goods as well as of discrepancies in weights and quantities.
- Maintains shipping and receiving logs.
- Performs routing and coordination of scheduled deliveries.

SHIPPING/RECEIVING CLERK - POSITION CODE 3713

- Processing of paperwork for incoming or outgoing shipments.
- Routing of incoming material to appropriate destinations.
- Completes paperwork necessary for that shipment (labels and bills of lading).

- In-depth analysis of transportation, distribution, operations and network design, and warehouse capacity modeling.
- May include maintenance and improvement of the model used to conduct product inventory projections.
- May monitor inventory levels and make recommendations.

Post-secondary degree with extensive experience in Logistics or Supply Chain Management and several P.Log. Modules completed.

TRANSPORTATION MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3721

Responsibility for management of regional or segmented industry transportation and distribution services, and operational execution including development of customer service process improvements. Duties may include:

- Identifies issues relating to logistics forecasting, modeling, and inventory projections.
- Coordinates delivery of domestic and international customer shipment and carrier relations services.
- Manages to service agreement levels (carriers, suppliers and customs brokers).
- Implements or coordinates designated outsourcing opportunities and vendor selection.
- Documents transportation metrics and performance standards.
- Management and supervision of department staff and budget.

DISPATCHER - POSITION CODE 3791

Fully competent. Responsible for efficient and effective coordination of inbound and outbound equipment and personnel to meet client and/or company's requirements. Acts as the liaison between warehouse and carriers ensuring to meet established schedule requirements. Duties may include:

- Handles incoming phone requests for services, process and transmit information to field personnel via radio, telephone or cell phone.
- Maintains documentation of crew activities.
- Manages vendor relations with third party transport companies.
- Submit and validate daily reports related to inventory/ receiving/ shipping.

High school diploma is required with strong clerical and communication skills. Has a minimum 3 - 5 years in the dispatch/transportation environment. High School with a license to operate a truck (licensing requirements vary). Possesses a safe driving record.

TRUCK DRIVER - LIGHT - POSITION CODE 3795

Operates a truck that transports cargo to and from specified locations. Duties may include:

- Operating a vehicle weighing less than 3 tons and having three or more axles.
- Ensures vehicle is in proper operating condition. Relies on instructions and pre-established guidelines to perform the functions of the job.

High School with a license to operate a truck (licensing requirements vary). Possesses a safe driving record.

EQUIPMENT AND MAINTENANCE

DIRECTOR MAINTENANCE - POSITION CODE 4471 (NEW)

Senior Management Level. Provides strong visible leadership within the maintenance group in the areas of safety, sustainable development, cost control and organizational effectiveness by managing the process and securing the resources to effectively manage maintenance. Duties may include:

- Develops and implements maintenance strategies, processes and programs in preventative and predictive maintenance which maximize the efficiency of equipment and minimize lifecycle costs and reduce unscheduled downtime.

DIRECTOR EQUIPMENT - POSITION CODE 4472 (NEW)

Senior Management Level. Directs the operations of the equipment procurement and the equipment inventory management function. Duties may include:

- Manages the records, licenses, inspections, warrantees, and service agreements for the organization's equipment and tools.
- Minimizes organizational cost through product standardization and tracking.
- Oversees the overall equipment budget, monitoring the cost and effectiveness of activities to optimize resources and
 prioritize spending by ensuring measurable yearly equipment operating and capital targets are prepared and
 implemented to maximize both the short-term and the long-term value of equipment.
- Tracks quality throughout the product lifetime.
- Secures the resources to effectively manage the equipment program.

Requires a bachelor's degree and 12+ years of experience in the field or in a related area, thorough knowledge of equipment reliability as well as familiarity with a variety of the equipment management concepts, practices and procedures.

EQUIPMENT MANAGER - POSITION CODE 4475

Manager Level. Responsible for buying, selling, coordination and daily maintenance of the company fleet of major equipment. Duties may include:

- Building and maintaining vendor relationships.
- Maintaining work order system deployment, accuracy and compliance.
- Ensuring equipment is maintained and repaired on a regular basis
- Ensuring that inventory is available to meet schedules.
- Reporting and managing of any incidents involving equipment.
- Tracking and ensuring proper protocols are followed and implemented properly.
- Analyzing data / information to make recommendations and creating necessary procedures on accepted standards.
- Ensuring that all aspects of logistics are supported and tracked.

Post-secondary certificate or diploma in related field is required. Minimum of 10 years experience in industrial, construction or related field as well as management experience. Familiarity with heavy equipment and provincial certification is preferred.

EQUIPMENT COORDINATOR - POSITION CODE 4478

Responsible for the organizing and inventory control of equipment required for projects. Duties may include:

- Orchestrating equipment transfers between sites.
- Ensuring that equipment is maintained regularly and repaired as required.
- Ensuring that inventory is appropriate & accurate to meet project schedules.
- Verifying the defined standards for quality are met.
- Analyzing maintenance work order feedback, update database accurately and on time.
- Ensuring compliance to safety procedures, standard activities and accepted principles
- Participating in planning and scheduling within work systems.
- Involved in tracking new orders, equipment transfers and maintenance requisitions.

- Supervising maintenance planner and workforce of equipment maintenance mechanics.

Fully Competent. Responsible for the assessment of maintenance needs and requirements, and developing schedules to ensure safety and work ready equipment. This role acts as a liaison with planners, supervisors and maintainers. Duties may include:

- Planning and scheduling repair of equipment.
- Maintain and support equipment records and repair history.
- Provide data for cause and failure analysis.
- Participate in planning and scheduling processes within work systems.
- May provide training or mentorship to junior staff as required.

- Supervising and scheduling shop personnel.
- Providing training to technicians as required.
- Keeping a maintenance schedule for all units.
- Ensuring equipment is compliant with government legislation and regulations.
- Maintaining and completing proper work orders and unit maintenance files.

- Architecture configuration, file sets and enterprise application integration.
- Manages operating procedures for partner systems.

EDI SUPPORT SPECIALIST - POSITION CODE 3740

Provides ongoing support and monitoring to ensure e-business operations are continually available. Duties may include:

- Creates and maintains trading partner relationships with EDI customers.

PRODUCTION PLANNER 1 - POSITION CODE 3783

Developmental Level. Based on customer requirements, prepares production schedules for selected operations within the context of a broader production plan. Duties may include:

- Run production simulation.
- Analyze & set min/max inventory levels.
- Analyze & review Sale forecast/internal demand forecast.
- Assist in the development of e input into short-term short term fixed production plan and the capacity Master Plan for internal production.
- Meets regularly with various groups (warehousing, production managers, quality control and sales) to revise
 production plans in response to changing customer and operations requirements.

Typically has post-secondary education. Working towards APICS or CAPICS Certification. Possesses an understanding of operations, products and inventory management.

PRODUCTION MAINTENANCE PLANNER - POSITION CODE 3784

Fully Competent. Develops daily, weekly and other periodic work schedules to perform maintenance on all equipment. Duties may include:

- Coordinating labour resources, equipment, parts and materials to support the maintenance function in the areas of breakdown, preventative, predictive and condition-based maintenance.
- Coordinating and scheduling routines for condition monitoring.
- Maintaining equipment history.
- Ensuring cost control of maintenance activities.

DIRECTOR HEALTH, SAFETY & ENVIRONMENT - POSITION CODE 3764

Senior Management Level. Responsible for developing and managing organization's (or division's) occupational health and safety and environment programs and compliance. Duties may include:

- Accountable for the overall Safety program, administration and initiatives.
- Manages, plans and implements all HSE programs for the organization.
- Interfaces with government, industry, and regulatory bodies to ensure compliance with standards and regulations.
- Mentors, coaches and advises operational management regarding principles of organizations HSE programs.
- Directs surveillance inspections and controls hazardous working conditions, or unsafe employee activities.
- Ensure reliable and timely safety statistical reporting.
- Management and supervision of department staff and budget.

Post-secondary degree in business or related field, and familiarity with and procedures for construction site safety, regulations, emergency procedures and WCB requirements. A minimum of 10 years related industry experience, with several Canadian Registered Safety Professional (CRSP) certification in addition top supervisory experience.

SAFETY MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3766

Management Level. Responsible for developing and managing organization's (or division's) occupational health and safety prevention issues. Duties may include:

- Plans, implements, and supervises all project safety, accident, and fire protection programs for the organization.
- Interfaces with government, industry, and regulatory bodies to ensure compliance with standards and regulations.
- Analyzes need and determines specifications for protective safety equipment, materials, and gear.
- Directs surveillance inspections and controls hazardous working conditions, or unsafe employee activities.
- Ensures all required records and reports are complete, accurate, and submitted per established procedures.

- Document discrepancies and work with other technical personnel on the resolution.

- Make recommendations on safety standards and procedures.

SAFETY OFFICER - POSITION CODE 3767

Fully Competent. Responsible for developing, implementing and training all staff in occupational health and safety prevention issues. Duties may include:

- Promoting a proactive safety strategy and ensuring worker safety and cost containment for all claims.
- Ensuring adherence to regulated and documented safety standards (dangerous goods and environmental protection).
- Seeking continuous improvement to safety by conducting monthly inspections, hazard analysis, and periodic audits.
- Managing WCB disability claims, and return-to-work programs, and may attend WCB hearings.
- Producing reports and statistical information, analyzing trends and presenting findings to management.
- Monitors aspects of a worker's medical status including evaluating modified positions to determine suitability for worker restrictions.
- Identifies medical community alternatives and programs available locally to reduce worker down time.

QUALITY CONTROL

Provides product and operational guidance for the purpose of ensuring thorough testing of company products, manufacturing processes, packaging and transportation.

QUALITY CONTROL MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3753

Responsible for ensuring thorough testing of company products, processes, and packaging and to ensure all products and services meet internal or external client requirements, in addition to company standards. Duties may include:

- Implements best practices and methods for product development and implementation.
- Liaise with quality, engineering, maintenance and logistics to ensure safety, quality and production goals are met.
- Manages defect management and change control process.
- Management and supervision of department staff and budget.

Typically has post-secondary education in Business (or equivalent), completion of several P. Log. Modules, with 10+ years related experience including supervisory experience. Comprehensive knowledge of industry specific QA/QC programs.

QUALITY CONTROL SPECIALIST - POSITION CODE 3754

Specialist Level. Responsible for designing processes and procedures to ensure high levels of Quality Assurance for products, services and projects. Duties may include:

- Develops and implements best practices and methods for design and implementation.
- Document discrepancies and work with other technical personnel on the resolution.
- Select common testing tools that will become the standard for ensuring products are accurately and thoroughly tested.
- Make recommendations on QA standards and procedures.
- Assist in planning and managing major quality assurance efforts.
- Provide technical guidance and training for other QA analysts.

Typically has post-secondary education in Business (or equivalent), completion of several P. Log. Modules, with 6 - 8 years related experience. Comprehensive knowledge of industry specific QA/QC programs.

QUALITY CONTROL ANALYST 3 - POSITION CODE 3755

Fully Competent Level. Responsible for designing, establishing and executing quality controls that will deliver a product within established specifications. Duties may include:

- Documents discrepancies and working with other product design personnel on resolution.
- Selects common testing methods / tools and standards for ensuring products are accurately and thoroughly tested.
- Assists in planning and managing all quality control efforts.
- Coordination of work for subordinates.

Typically has post-secondary education in Business (or equivalent), with a minimum of 5 - 6 years quality control or assurance work experience. Strong knowledge of industry specific QA/QC programs.



QUALITY CONTROL ANALYST 2 - POSITION CODE 3756

Intermediate Level. Responsible for ensuring that products and services meet organization standards and client requirements. Duties may include:

- Selects products for testing.
- Inspects specifications for inaccuracies and completeness.
- Writes and executes quality control processes using documented specifications.
- Equipment calibration control management.
- Verifies that any problems are resolved, and provides input to QC Management regarding recurring problems.

Typically has post-secondary education (or equivalent), with a minimum of 3 - 4 years quality control or assurance work experience. Good knowledge of industry specific QA/QC programs and standards.

QUALITY CONTROL ANALYST 1 - POSITION CODE 3757

Developmental Level. Responsible for inspecting and testing products and services against organization standards and client requirements. Duties may include:

ASSET MANAGEMENT MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3840 (NEW)

Responsible for the strategic management of physical assets during their life in the organization by managing assets so that the greatest return is achieved for productive assets. Duties may include:

- Creates and implements a process system by which assets that are of value are monitored and maintained and when are no longer required prepares for disposal.

Responsible for managing, tracking and reporting physical assets in the company. Duties may include:

- Maintains records and databases for an asset management inventory system.
- Applies corporate controlled tracking mechanisms, and updates asset attributes.
- Examines and reports on assets through the process system by which assets that are of value are monitored and maintained and when are no longer required prepares for disposal.

DIRECTOR OPERATIONS - POSITION CODE 3771

Responsible for a single operational unit or facility. Duties may include:

- Oversees manufacturing, development, process, supply chain, quality control and compliance.
- Plans, develops and implements operational strategies in the context of overall organizational strategy.
- Responsible for the financial performance of the facility operations.
- Develops policies for line operational area; plans, directs and assists departmental staff in achieving operational results.
- Recommends, monitors and reports on results against budgetary and performance measures.
- Ensures that internal control measures are maintained
- Manages personnel, work allocation, training, problem resolution and employee performance to achieve peak productivity.
- Advises on the introduction of new processes, equipment, and products to improve operational effectiveness.

Typically has post-secondary degree with significant management and operations experience.

OPERATIONS MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3770

Responsible for ensuring the efficient day-to-day operations of a facility or site. Duties may include:

- Plan, organize, direct and control daily operations.
- Manages personnel, work allocation, training, problem resolution and employee performance to achieve peak productivity.
- Establishes and implement production schedules, inventory stock levels.
- Oversees maintenance of inventory and plant equipment and quality control for site.
- Acts as a liaison with other departments to ensure operations are running accordingly and efficiently.

Post-secondary education in Business or related field. Minimum 8 - 10 years experience in related field. Has significant supervisory experience and understanding of the business.

PRODUCTION PLANT MANAGER (LEVEL 3) - POSITION CODE 3772

Responsible for day-to-day plant operations. Duties may include:

- Develops plants operational plans. Prepares, monitors and administers the annual plant operating and capital equipment budget.
- Manages, develops and implements policies affecting plant operations.
- Introduces/manages systems to track and improve operational effectiveness.
- Introduces/manages initiatives to improve safety, health and employee relations in the work environment.
- Manages and develops plant leadership.
- Builds effective working relationships with other areas of the business.

Typically has a Technical or Business Diploma. May have a business or engineering degree. Has extensive plant or technical management experience.

PRODUCTION SUPERINTENDENT (LEVEL 2) - POSITION CODE 3773

Responsible for several production areas. May be Plant Manager of a small plant. Duties may include:

- Works through Plant Supervisors to ensure co-ordination and achievement of area objectives (quality, cost, timelines, safety, customer satisfaction etc.).
- Monitors trends and supervises initiatives affecting use of new equipment, processes, and operations.
- Reviews progress against area objectives and implements operational changes as requires.
- Develops, manages operational budget.
- Reports to Plant Manager in a large plant or VP Operations in a smaller plant.

Typically has a Technical or Business Diploma. Has in-depth knowledge, skills and experience in plant operations. Has significant supervisory experience and understanding of the business.



PRODUCTION SUPERVISOR (LEVEL 1) - POSITION CODE 3774

Responsible for the processes and output of one or more production areas in a plant. Duties may include:

- Works through several shift supervisors to ensure production achieves production goals (relative to quality, volumes cost, timeliness etc.).
- Ensures areas have required resources (manpower, materials, equipment, workable production plans).
- Ensures effective equipment maintenance, safety, housekeeping standards are maintained.
- Builds and maintains a healthy and safe work environment.
- Reports to the Plant Superintendent in a large plant or the Plant Manager in a small plant.

Typically has a High School diploma. May have a technical or business diploma. Has in-depth technical knowledge, skills and experience in several production areas. Good communication and problem solving skills.

SHIFT SUPERVISOR - POSITION CODE 3775

First level of supervision. Provides day-to-day operational direction of a crew of operators/assemblers. Duties may include:

- Schedules and co-ordinates the work on each shift.
- Observes and checks the work in progress to ensure operating, material procession, and safety standards are met.
- Ensures safety and housekeeping standards are maintained.
- May have input into recommendations regarding performance management, recruiting and other HR activities.
- Oversees the training of junior staff.
- Makes routine decisions and recommendations within established guidelines.
- Exercises judgment in selection of applicable methods, processes.

Typically has a High School diploma. May have some technical post-secondary education. Has in-depth technical knowledge, skills and experience in area of work. Good communication and problem solving skills.

OPERATOR / ASSEMBLER 4 - POSITION CODE 3776

Senior Level. May be informal lead of production team. Operates with minimal direction and provides expert skills in the assembly, processing and maintenance of a wide range of complex and new products and operations. Duties may include:

- Acts as the team's expert trouble-shooter.
- Recommends changes in manufacturing and design processes or addition of quality control measures.
- Develops operating procedures for new equipment. May assemble, repair or modify test units.
- May provide work direction, mentoring, modeling or training to junior staff.
- Typically has High School diploma. May have some technical post-secondary education. Has in-depth

technical/mechanical knowledge, skills and experience in assembling, processing and repairing a wide range of complex equipment or products specific to this industry.

OPERATOR / ASSEMBLER 3 - POSITION CODE 3777

Fully competent Level. Works as a member of a production team in a variety of situations using varied processes and materials to produce a wide range of products. Duties may include:

- Performs complex assembly, processing or repair of products or equipment.
- Ensures correct operation of production equipment through observation of varied monitoring devices.
- May track defects in products, equipment and conduct inspections.
- Skilled in final inspections, safety and materials handling.

Typically has High School diploma. May have some technical post-secondary education. Has technical/mechanical knowledge, skills and experience in assembling, processing and repairing a wide range of equipment or products specific to this industry.



OPERATOR / ASSEMBLER 2 - POSITION CODE 3778

Developmental Level. Under general supervision, performs repetitive tasks as a member of a production team, which produces a limited number of products. Duties may include:

- Identifies and understands use of varied electronic/manual equipment. Follows repetitive, well-defined procedures and more varied equipment to assemble, process or repair a range of standardized products.
- Uses a variety of instruments to monitor operations. May be required to perform go/no go testing.
- Develops skills in quality, safety and materials handling, and general maintenance.
- Shift work may be required.

Typically has High School diploma. May have some technical post-secondary education. Has a demonstrated aptitude for mechanical/technical work. Has some related manufacturing experience. Familiar with reading and understanding specification sheets, acceptance testing, quality controls and processes.

OPERATOR / ASSEMBLER 1 - POSITION CODE 3779

Entry Level. Under close supervision, learns to perform routine, repetitive tasks as a member of a production team, which produces a limited number of products. Duties may include:

- Identifies and understands use of specific electronic/manual equipment.
- Follows repetitive, well defined procedures, and uses simple equipment to assemble or process a narrow range of products.
- Understands and can use instruments which monitor equipment operations.
- Develops skills in set-ups and assists senior operators.
- Develops skills in routine safety and material handling.
- Shift work may be required.

Typically has a High School diploma. May have some technical post-secondary education or some manufacturing experience. Has an aptitude for mechanical/technical work.

MANUFACTURING ENGINEERING

MANUFACTURING/PROCESS ENGINEERING MANAGER - POSITION CODE 4623 (REVISED TITLE) (REVISED)

Responsible for the planning, development, implementation, and maintenance of manufacturing methods, processes, and operations for new and existing products, machines and tools. Duties may include:

- Ensures the effective use of materials, equipment and personnel in producing quality products at minimum costs.
- Acts as a liaison with engineering in releasing new products.
- Develops systems to maintain reports and record keeping of company products.
- Selects, develops, and evaluated personnel to ensure the efficient operation of the function.
- Manages the activities of a section or department with responsibility for results, including costs, methods and staffing.
- Works on issues of diverse scope where analysis of situation or data requires evaluation of a variety of factors including an understanding of current business trends.

University degree, preferably in Mechanical, Industrial or Process Engineering. Has a minimum of 12 years of related experience including supervisory.

MANUFACTURING/PROCESS ENGINEER SPECIALIST (Level E) - POSITION CODE 4625 (REVISED TITLE) (REVISED)

Specialist Level. Responsible for the development, direction and implementation of operations and processes in the production/manufacturing of materials. Duties may include:

- Optimizes and leads the productivity and design in the manufacturing of materials.
- Meets quality and safety standards.
- May direct more junior technical staff.
- Drives continuous improvement processing strategies to keep up with industry standards.
- Monitors current and new equipment, tool and process reliability.
- Works with production team to reduce costs.

University degree, preferably in Mechanical, Industrial or Process Engineering. Has a minimum of 10 – 12 years of related experience.



MANUFACTURING/PROCESS ENGINEER (Level D) - POSITION CODE 4626 (REVISED TITLE) (REVISED)

Senior Level. Responsible for the development, and implementation of operations and processes in the production/manufacturing of materials. Duties may include:

- Develops process productivity improvement and design in the manufacturing of materials.
- Meets quality and safety standards.
- Reports to the manufacturing engineering manager and may advise on technical problems.
- Drives continuous improvement in processing strategies to keep up with industry standards.
- Monitors current and new equipment, tool and process reliability.
- Works with production team to reduce costs.

University degree, preferably in Mechanical, Industrial or Process Engineering. Has a minimum of 7 - 8 years of related experience.

MANUFACTURING/PROCESS ENGINEER (Level C) - POSITION CODE 4627 (REVISED TITLE) (REVISED)

Fully Competent Level. Responsible for the implementation of operations and processes in the production/manufacturing of materials. Duties may include:

- Implements process productivity improvement and design in the manufacturing of materials.
- Meets quality and safety standards.
- Works is generally not supervised and may direct lower level engineers.
- Develops continuous improvement in processing strategies to keep up with industry standards.
- Monitor current and new equipment, tool and process reliability.
- Works with production team to reduce costs.

University degree, preferably in Mechanical, Industrial or Process Engineering. Has a minimum of 5 - 6 years of related experience.

MANUFACTURING/PROCESS ENGINEER (Level B) - POSITION CODE 4628 (REVISED TITLE) (REVISED)

Intermediate Level. Assists in the development and implementation of operations and processes in the production/manufacturing of materials. Duties may include:

- Assists in the design of the manufacturing/processing of materials.
- Meets quality and safety standards.
- Assists with continuous improvement in processing strategies to keep up with industry standards.
- Monitors current and new equipment, tool and process reliability.
- Obtains, correlates, and analyzes technical information needed to accomplish assigned tasks.
- Works with production team to reduce costs.

University degree, preferably in Mechanical, Industrial or Process Engineering. Normally has 2 - 3 years related experience.

MANUFACTURING/PROCESS ENGINEER (Level A) - POSITION CODE 4629 (REVISED TITLE) (REVISED)

Developmental Level. Engineer in Training performing a variety of tasks involving the application of basic engineering/scientific principles to assigned problems. Duties may include:

- Responsible for routine technical decisions within clearly defined procedures or precedents.
- Obtains, correlates, and analyzes technical information needed to accomplish assigned tasks.
- Prepares reports, charts, graphs, and other documents and makes recommendations to senior staff.
- Prepares simple plans, designs, calculations, costs and bills of material, in accordance with established codes, standards, drawings or other specifications and under supervision.

Typically requires Bachelor's degree in Engineering with less than 2 years of related experience.



MANUFACTURING ENGINEERING TECHNICIAN 2 - POSITION CODE 4633

Senior Level. Performs a variety of complex technical functions related to the development and operations of the manufacturing equipment and facilities. Duties may include:

- Performs operational tests and fault isolation on systems and equipment to ensure conformance with design specifications.
- Troubleshoot technical and mechanical problems.
- Provides design details where necessary.
- Recommends modifications to designs.
- Utilizes a wide variety of developmental tests or diagnostic equipment to monitor, test and troubleshoot complex or complete systems.

Typically required is technical school graduation with a minimum of 5 years directly related work experience in manufacturing development.

MANUFACTURING ENGINEERING TECHNICIAN 1 - POSITION CODE 4634

Intermediate Level. Performs moderately complex activities related to development and or maintenance of the manufacturing equipment and facilities. Duties may include:

- Assists in general research work.
- Troubleshoot technical and mechanical problems.
- Conducts tests and detailed experimentation to collect development data.
- Assists in prototype fabrication and assembly.
- Performs construction, troubleshooting, and repair of standard and test equipment.

Typically requires Technical school graduation with 2 - 3 years experience.

Alternatively, may work as an internal authority, responsible for programs that shape the future direction of the organization and solve the most complex and challenging issues. Duties may include:

- Plans and implement research science strategies and activities.
- Manages and conducts scientific research development and technical programs to develop new innovative products or enhancements.
- Determines and establishes goals, scope, approaches, and budgets to accomplish overall objectives and goals.
- Provides ongoing guidance, coaching and feedback to direct reports.

• May lead a large research science function or department or a group of highly specialized industry experts. Typically has a BSc. or grad degree, with 15+ years of broad research experience, with a significant amount of experience in a management or leadership role.



R & D MANAGER - POSITION CODE 4643

Management Level. Responsible for planning, organizing, and directing the work activities and staff of an R & D function and directing several groups. Duties may include:

- Plans and implement research science strategies and activities such as:
- Manages and conducts scientific research development and technical programs to develop new innovative products or enhancements.
- Determines and establishes goals, scope, approaches, and budgets to accomplish overall objectives and goals.
- Provides ongoing guidance, coaching and feedback to direct reports.
- May lead a large research science function or department or a group of highly specialized industry experts.

Typically has a BSc or grad degree, with 12+ years of broad research experience, with experience in a leadership role.

SCIENTIST 5 - POSITION CODE 4645

Expert Level. Provides high level technical expertise for the design and development of new research approaches and projects. Acknowledged expert specialist within industry and company. Has an extensive record of technical excellence and innovation demonstrated through publications, patents and the solution of significant business problems. Duties may include:

- Project planning, scheduling and tracking.
- Working independently, researches designs, and develops state of the art products.
- May develop ground-breaking prototypes of components and devises.
- Researches and defines innovative solutions to the most complex and technically challenging hardware issues.
- Is generally recognized as a leader in their technical specialty.
- May provide mentoring and coaching to other technical employees.

Typically has a BSc. or grad degree, with extensive research experience, highly competent in a variety of specialty areas.

SCIENTIST 4 - POSITION CODE 4646

Specialist Level. Demonstrates originality and creativity in research, which produces practical and economic solutions to business problems. Leads and participates in short and long term project planning. Work is assigned in terms of broad objectives and is reviewed from a policy perspective. Duties may include:

- Works independently in performing in-depth analysis, interpretation and recommendation of technical solutions.
- Provides technical guidance and advice to other project team members.
- Recognized internally and externally for technical expertise.

Requires a degree in specific area of science with minimum 8 - 10 years industry experience, typically with a specialty area.

SCIENTIST 3 - POSITION CODE 4647

Senior Level. Plans and conducts experiments to solve significant or unusual problems. Demonstrates strong technical competence in area of specialization, and creativity in devising new approaches and developing new applications and interpreting test results. Duties may include:

- Responsible for managing medium-sized projects or more complex projects.
- Works independently in performing in-depth analysis, interpretation and recommendation of technical solutions.
- Provides technical guidance and advice to other project team members.

Requires a degree in specific area of science with minimum 5 - 7 years industry experience, typically with a specialty area.

SCIENTIST 2 - POSITION CODE 4648

Fully Competent. Works independently, conducting analysis, interpreting data and developing conclusions. Demonstrates technical competence in carrying out experiments, and using established procedures to solve varied problems. Technical guidance is usually available to assist with unusual problems. Duties may include:

- May contribute to more complex and unusual tests conducted by a senior scientist.
- Works independently in performing in analysis and the interpretation of results.
- May provide work guidance to more junior technical staff within the scope of a specific project.

Requires a degree in specific science with minimum 3 - 4 years related industry experience.

- Responsible for routine technical decisions within clearly defined procedures or precedents.

Requires a degree in specific science with limited industry experience.

LAB MANAGER - POSITION CODE 4652

Responsible for the management of the lab and its people; ensuring budget, and efficient operations and resources. Duties may include:

- Managing the lab, including, hiring, monthly scheduling, performance management, employee dismissal, coaching, and feedback.
- Responsible for budgeting and purchasing.
- Reporting sample reports, worth contribution, and tracking of sample numbers.
- Project coordination interaction with field, plant manufacturing, and technical services.
- Contract administration with labs testing.

LAB TECHNOLOGIST 2 - POSITION CODE 4655

This role is responsible for conducting complex laboratory testing, analysis and reporting. Duties may include:

- Conducts routine analysis (3 routine groups total water, solids and waxes, and residuals corrosion) for field sales force; including testing, analytical assessments, and generating data and reports.
- Performs role as Safety Coordinator, including scheduling monthly meetings, agendas, minutes, action items, etc.

- Performs role as Safety Coordinator, including scheduling monthly meetings, agendas, minutes, action items, etc.

- Develops unique methods for remediation and environmental problem resolution for complex projects.
- Recognized as a leader in their technical specialty.
- Provides mentoring and coaching to other technical employees.

Minimum of a bachelor's degree in Science/Geology/Environmental Science/Engineering, with extensive experience, highly competent in a variety of specialty areas.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENTIST 4 - POSITION CODE 4673 (NEW)

Specialist Level: Provides both business and technical expertise for environmental site assessment and remediation. Duties may include:

- Responsible for the technical integrity of major, technically complex projects, often responsible for the management
 of resources for these projects.
- Provide integrated, multidisciplinary services to identify and assess liabilities and risks, and to develop solutions to site management, remediation and mitigation, environmental assessment and compliance programs, and related environmental support services.
- Provides technical guidance to other project team members.

University degree in Science/Geology/Environmental Science/Engineering with a minimum of 8 - 10 years of related experience.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENTIST 3 - POSITION CODE 4674 (NEW)

Senior Level. Responsible for conducting a variety of site assessment and remediation projects. Duties may include:

- Leads environmental site assessments and remediation projects.
- Develops and leads teams in all phases of planning, execution, and delivery of management projects.
- Utilizes knowledge of remediation and other environmental principles to execute projects and tasks.
- Secures environmental approvals and permits with various agencies.
- Provides work mentorship and activity co-ordination of junior technical staff/project sub-contractors.
- Monitors staff and subcontractors conducting field investigations.
- Prepares technical reports and proposals and reviews the work of junior staff.

University degree in Science/Geology/Environmental Science/Engineering with a minimum of 5 – 7 years of related experience.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENTIST 2 - POSITION CODE 4675 (NEW)

Fully Competent Level. Provides a lead role in undertaking project-related tasks utilizing their expertise and guidance for environmental site assessments, soil and groundwater monitoring. Duties may include:

- Conducts environmental site assessments for remediation planning, construction monitoring, erosion and sediment control.
- Collects soil and groundwater samples and conducts borehole logging and groundwater monitoring well installations.
- Analyzes soil and groundwater data, developing site models and preparing technical reports.
- Performs independent studies, analyses, interpretations and conclusions within the scope of various assigned projects.
- Liaises with regulatory authorities working within the legislations of provincial and federal boundaries.

• Mentors Junior Environmental Scientists on standards and procedures relating to technical deliverables. University degree in Science/Geology/Environmental Science/Engineering with minimum 3- 4 years related industry experience.



ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENTIST 1 - POSITION CODE 4676 (NEW)

Developmental Level. Under general supervision, provides technical expertise, guidance in environmental site assessments, soil and groundwater monitoring. Duties may include:

- Conducts introductory stage environmental site assessments for remediation planning, construction monitoring, erosion and sediment control.
- Collects soil and groundwater samples and assists with borehole logging and groundwater monitoring well installations.
- Analyzes soil and groundwater data, develops site models and prepares technical reports.

University degree in Science/Geology/Environmental Science/Engineering with less than 2 years of related experience.

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE

DIRECTOR FACILITIES - POSITION CODE 3805

Responsible for the planning, managing, upgrading and repair of large, complex company facilities or several facilities in different locations. Duties may include:

- Develops plans for the effective utilization of company assets.
- Negotiates with realtors, leasing agencies for renewal of rental agreements, purchase/sale of space.
- Ensures facilities are utilized in a cost effective manner.
- Manages maintenance and operation of facilities.
- Establishes overall facility safety standards, policies and procedures.
- Works with suppliers and contractors to manage new construction, and renovation of existing facilities.
- Manages third party contracts regarding facilities operation.
- Manages staff assigned to maintenance and operations.

Typically has post-secondary education with a minimum of 8 - 10 years of increasingly responsible experience in facility maintenance and administration.

FACILITIES MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3810

Responsible for the planning, managing, upgrading and repair of company facilities, equipment and properties. Duties may include:

- Develops plans for the effective utilization of company assets.
- Negotiates with realtors, leasing agencies for renewal of rental agreements, purchase/sale of space.
- Ensures facilities are utilized in a cost effective and safe manner including:
- Maintenance and operation of facilities in a safe and clean manner.
- Sets overall facility safety standards, or liaises with Health & Safety staff to ensure adherence to standards.
- Works with suppliers and contractors to manage new construction, and renovation of existing facilities.
- Manages third party contracts regarding facilities operation.
- Ensures fire alarms and equipment are regularly maintained and safety drills are conducted.
- Manages staff assigned to maintenance and operations.

FACILITIES COORDINATOR - POSITION CODE 3815

Coordinates the operations of company facilities, equipment and properties. Duties may include:

- Supports the overall corporate facilities plan including builds and renovations, subleases, and furniture and equipment requirements.
- Maintains regulatory documentation, safety records, leasing, legal and related facility files.
- Assists with project management and contractor schedules.
- Provides guidance to operations and maintenance staff and contractors.
- Updates defined procedures and standards for facility-wide distribution and provides clerical support.

Typically has 3 - 5 years of facilities or property management administration experience, combined with a High School education. Proficient with several software applications. Good communications and organizational skills required.



FACILITIES ASSISTANT - POSITION CODE 3816 (NEW)

Responsible for providing clerical/administrative support to the Facilities Maintenance department. Duties may include:

- Prepares reports including the researching, compiling and summarizing of data.
- Assists facilities coordinator and specialists with documents review to corporate standards.
- Provides correspondence to keep employees informed of new facility procedures and security advisories.
- Provides meeting and workshop support by organizing logistics.
- Collects, prepares, develops and/or compiles all documentation for meetings/discussions, including presentation materials.

High school diploma with some facility maintenance/property management administration experience.

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE MECHANIC - POSITION CODE 3811

Fully Competent. Performs a wide variety of skilled general maintenance, repair, and modification of machinery and mechanical equipment. Duties may include:

- Performs preventative maintenance on equipment and mechanical systems.
- Examination of mechanical equipment to diagnose potential future problems.
- Assembles and installs mechanical equipment and systems, following drawings, blueprints, and general instructions.
- May provide leadership to junior personnel.

Formal technical training with an ability to perform trade functions at the journeyman level.

MAINTENANCE WORKER - POSITION CODE 3812

Fully Competent. Performs routine, manual tasks involving repetitive and standardized assignments relating to the maintenance of facilities. Duties may include:

- Performs semi-skilled tasks in the maintenance, repair, and improvement of facilities.
- Carpentry and painting, and use of standard hand and power tools.
- Assists in the movement of furniture, materials, and equipment as needed.

Basic reading, writing, and arithmetical abilities with several years of general facility maintenance experience.

SANITATION CUSTODIAN - POSITION CODE 3817

Responsible for the sanitation and cleaning of the facilities. Duties may include:

- Cleans and sanitizes operational areas and equipment.
- Covering, disassembling or moving equipment as needed.
- Fills and labels sanitation supplies appropriately.
- Ensures supplies and chemicals are stored properly.
- Follows proper safety guidelines.

Previous custodial experience.

SECURITY MANAGER - POSITION CODE 3813

Plans, organizes, directs, and controls the activities and staff involved in developing and administering company security policies, procedures, and programs. Duties may include:

- Recommends procedures and systems for visitor control, employee identification, security clearance administration, and the safeguard of company facilities, equipment, and material.
- Provides security controls of company facilities, equipment, and materials.
- Provides security control through direction of a guard force or through retention of contract services.
- Responsible for employees in security function.

Knowledge of security requirements and practices normally obtained through a minimum of 4 years of related experience, as well as experience in directing others.

SECURITY GUARD - POSITION CODE 3814

Fully Competent. Guards and patrols company property. Duties may include:

- Protection of property and personnel against fire, theft, vandalism, illegal entry, and other hazards.
- Controls entrance points.
- Tours premises to examine doors, windows, and gates to ensure appropriate level of security.
- Observes incoming and outgoing persons to guard against theft of company property.

High school diploma with basic reading, writing, and communication skills.



MINING OPERATIONS (NEW)

MINE MANAGER - POSITION CODE 4710 (NEW)

Plans, administers and reviews the production activities of the mining operation to optimize resource use, minimize costs and maintain quality standards. The Mine Manager will inspire the mining team to create a safe, motivated and productive environment which leads to innovative continuous improvement. Duties may include:

- Directs the formulation of mining production strategies, policies and plans.
- Plans production schedules, labor and material input requirements to meet output quantity, quality and timing specifications.
- Directs the development of sound strategic plans and life of mine schedules.
- Coordinates the implementation of occupational health and safety requirements.
- Conducts research and applies new and improved methods and products to mine production.
- Oversees the acquisition and installation of new machinery.
- Oversees updates of mineral resource and ore reserve estimates, as well as grade control.
- Monitors production costs and adjusts processes and resources to minimize costs.
- Controls the preparation of production records and reports.

Requires degree in mining or a related field, preferably registered or eligible for registration as a P.Eng/P.Geo, minimum 15 - 20 years mining experience, 5 years supervisory/management experience.

MINE MAINTENANCE MANAGER - POSITION CODE 4711 (NEW)

Direct, coordinate and integrate all technical aspects of operational and shutdown maintenance projects in accordance to mine requirements. Duties may include:

- Coordinates the work of the Maintenance Group with the Operations to ensure the efficient performance of activities.
- Develops long range detailed plans, schedules and procedures for the systematic maintenance of all equipment.
- Responsible for budgeting all maintenance costs and prepares capital and operating budgets.
- Reviews progress of work and compares the actual results with the planned results; initiates corrective action as required.
- Establishes shop layout to ensure that the most effective arrangement of maintenance facilities and equipment is obtained.
- Trains employees and installs work procedures to improve the efficiency of maintenance operations.
- Studies and develops methods of maintenance and revises periodically the program for systematic maintenance to improve the quality of the maintenance and reduce the cost.
- Plans and schedules maintenance work to minimize loss of production.
- Reduces overall cost of maintenance and improves the quality of service.

Degree in engineering plus a minimum 10 - 15 years of overall Mine Maintenance experience with 5 or more years experience in a Mine Maintenance Management or senior Mine Leadership role. Proven experience in Mine Maintenance Management.

MINERALS PROCESSING OPERATOR 3 - POSITION CODE 4712 (NEW)

Fully Competent. Involved in all aspects of mineral processing, including sampling and laboratory work. The minerals in their final form are produced by smelting. Duties may include:

- Assembles and dismantles equipment and fittings in ore-processing plants.
- Operates ore-crushing and screening plants using manual and computer-based systems, conveyers, feeders, weight-meters, roll mills, pumps, jigs, spirals and flotation cells.
- Loads, unloads and stores materials such as treatment chemicals and tools.
- Mixes ore-treating chemicals, catalysts and reagents.
- Clears blockages in materials-handling and transporting equipment.
- Cleans, washes and maintains equipment, and removes spillages and rubbish.
- Maintains auxiliary systems, such as drainage, fluids-pouring and conveyor-belt systems.
- Takes samples of materials for testing.
- Uses thickeners in the drying processes, pump tailings and manage tailings dams and associated raw-water systems.

Requires high school diploma or equivalent and 1+ years experience in processing operations.



MINERALS PROCESSING OPERATOR 2 - POSITION CODE 4713 (NEW)

Fully Competent. Responsible for component(s) of mineral processing which could involve sampling and laboratory work. Duties may include:

- Operates ore-crushing and screening plants using manual and computer-based systems, conveyers, feeders, weight-meters, roll mills, pumps, jigs, spirals and flotation cells.
- Mixes ore-treating chemicals, catalysts and reagents.
- Clears blockages in materials-handling and transporting equipment.
- Maintains auxiliary systems, such as drainage, fluids-pouring and conveyor-belt systems.
- Takes samples of materials for testing.
- Uses thickeners in the drying processes, pump tailings and manage tailings dams and associated raw-water systems.

Requires high school diploma or equivalent and some experience in processing operations.

MINERALS PROCESSING OPERATOR 1 - POSITION CODE 4714 (NEW)

Entry Level. Assist with mineral processing, including sampling and laboratory work. Duties may include:

- Works with more senior Operators to optimize production.
- Assists other Operators as required.
- Loads, unloads and stores materials such as treatment chemicals and tools.
- Cleans, washes and maintains equipment, and removes spillages and rubbish.
- Maintains housekeeping duties to ensure clean and safe work environment.

Requires high school diploma or equivalent.

DIAMOND DRILLER - POSITION CODE 4715 (NEW)

Moves, sets up, operates, and maintains diamond drilling rigs and related equipment that drills holes to obtain mineral (core) samples of the minerals from the surface or underground. Duties may include:

- Operates a variety of drills such as rotary, churn, and pneumatic to tap sub-surface water and salt deposits, to
 remove core samples during mineral exploration or soil testing, and to facilitate the use of explosives in mining or
 construction.
- Operates secondary equipment, including pumps and equipment used to prevent and correct problems.
- Selects and attaches drill bits and drill rods, adding more rods as hole depths increase, and changing drill bits as needed.
- Operates controls to stabilize machines and to position and align drills.
- Regulates air pressure, rotary speed, and downward pressure, according to the type of rock or concrete being drilled.
- Operates machines to flush earth cuttings or to blow dust from holes.
- Conducts tests and inspections of products, services, or processes to evaluate quality or performance.
- Performs routine maintenance and upgrade work on machines and equipment, and determining when and what kind of maintenance is needed.

Requires high school diploma (or equivalent), completion of industry courses combined with 1 - 3 years of experience WHMIS and First Aid training required.


PROSPECTOR - POSITION CODE 4716 (NEW)

Commonly contract work; claim-staking for mining and exploration companies. Explores likely regions to discover valuable mineral deposits using topographical maps, surveys, reports and knowledge of geology and mineralogy. Examines outcrops, placer, and stream channels for mineral content. Duties may include:

- Researches promising grounds through computer databases and the Internet, and carry global positioning systems to pinpoint mineralization.
- Explores likely regions for discovery using topographical maps, surveys, reports and knowledge of geology and mineralogy.
- Identifies common minerals and different types of alteration.
- Collects data on rock formations using geophysical instruments and devices.
- Drills, dynamites, or digs trenches or pits along rock formations or creek beds to obtain rock samples.
- Breaks off samples and tests them for presence of minerals with heat, acid, magnifying glass, or by pulverizing and washing or panning.
- Examines and maps rock types and collects rock and soil samples for mineral or chemical analysis.
- Determines the feasibility of staking and developing a claim.
- Stakes claims in accordance with federal or provincial/territorial legal requirements.

Requires high school diploma (or equivalent), Prospector's License and wilderness experience.

UNDERGROUND MINER - POSITION CODE 4717 (NEW)

Initiates the process of extracting rock and ore from the earth, with the use of sophisticated machines and equipment in order to ensure the ground is secure to drill the rock which contains the minerals and metals sought in preparation for blasting. Duties may include:

- Cuts channel under working face to facilitate blasting, using pick, or by operating cutting machine.
- Uses drill blast methods to advance mine openings and remove waste rock during mine development.
- Charges and shoots (sets off) explosives or air charges to blast down materials.
- Uses trucks, conveyor belts, hoists and other equipment to move ore and waster rock (muck) to the surface.
- Installs timbering, roof bolts, or cribs, to support walls and roof.
- Lays track to accommodate mine cars or track-mounted equipment.
- Develops mines by installing ground support, mine services (air and water), ventilation and equipment such as conveyor belts.
- Underground miners may operate a variety of mining equipment.

Requires high school diploma (or equivalent) and 1 - 2 years of progressive underground mining experience or related experience operating or maintaining heavy equipment.

DIAMOND DRILLER HELPER - POSITION CODE 4718 (NEW)

Assists driller in setup, operating, and maintaining diamond drilling rigs and related equipment that drill holes to obtain mineral (core) samples of the minerals from the surface or underground. Duties may include:

- Assists in drilling and blasting rock and the operation of a variety of drills such as rotary, churn, and pneumatic to tap sub-surface water and salt deposits, to remove core samples during mineral exploration or soil testing, and to facilitate the use of explosives in mining or construction.
- Positions and replaces various equipment to assist in the drilling operations such as pulling electric cables and water houses clear of machinery.
- Operates controls to stabilize machines and to position and align drills.
- Collects ore samples for laboratory analysis.
- Assists in operating machines to flush earth cuttings or to blow dust from holes.
- Performs routine maintenance and upgrade work on machines and equipment.

Requires high school diploma (or equivalent), completion of industry courses with limited experience WHMIS and First Aid training required.



MINING ENGINEER F+ - POSITION CODE 4720 (NEW)

Senior Management Level or Industry Expert. Responsible for long range mine planning, coordination, making specific and far-reaching management decisions, or may be acknowledged mining engineering expert within industry. Duties may include:

- Drives activities through strategic planning by development of operating philosophy, mine operations plans, and/or on site operating procedures.
- Develops, communicates and leads major strategic initiatives and operational strategies to drive operational
 performance, including adherence to systems, standards and procedures.
- Plans and implements engineering strategies and activities.
- Determines and establishes goals, scope, approaches, and budgets to accomplish overall objectives and goals. Requires Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor Degree in Engineering, Mining specialty).

MINING ENGINEER F - POSITION CODE 4721 (NEW)

Management Level or Expert. Plans, organizes, directs and controls the work activities and staff of a mining engineering or technical mining function or may be acknowledged as company mining expert with particular emphasis on mining engineering. Duties may include:

- Responsible for the organization of the Engineering function and/or operations.
- Maintains a high standard of operational, safety and environmental practices as well as the preparation of capital and operational budgets, short and long term planning and cost studies.
- Evaluates technical progress of projects to ensure sound application of scientific and engineering principles and adequate exploratory research to support the highest possible performance of the end product.
- Develops a complete data base and protocol for resources delineation.
- Coordinates with outside consultants to develop a reserves and resources assessment.
- Develop and maintain an ongoing dialogue with the mine operations to help in monitoring the performance of the Mine operation.
- Works with internal teams to accurately determine the reserves and resources of the mine(s).

Requires Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor Degree in Engineering, Mining specialty).

MINING ENGINEER E - POSITION CODE 4722 (NEW)

Specialist Level. Designs and develops new or innovative mining approaches and techniques with particular emphasis on mining engineering in the design and development of complex projects. Duties may include:

- Responsible for the development plans for high quality, low cost and efficient mine plans and underground or open pit mine designs conducting design viability studies (underground and open pit mines).
- Implements methodologies in conceptual, pre-feasibility, feasibility and existing operation projects providing
 necessary technical engineering information (plans, drawings, data sheets, etc.) to ensure proper project execution
 and monitoring the construction work.
- Conducts investigations and tests of considerable complexity, projects progress and evaluates results.
- Lays out and directs mine construction operations, such as location and development of shafts, tunnels, chambers, position of excavation benches (levels), and access roads.
- Designs, implements, and monitors facility projects, such as water and power supply, ventilation system, rock-dust and radon gas control, drainage, rail and conveyor systems, and material cleaning, grading, and reduction systems.

Requires Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor Degree in Engineering, Mining specialty).

MINING ENGINEER D - POSITION CODE 4723 (NEW)

Senior Level. Plans and directs projects or phases of mining projects within an assigned mining engineering functional area and provides technical mining direction to and coordinates the efforts of mining engineering staff. Duties may include:

- Support startup planning, field punch outs, systems turnover sequence planning, etc., and specifies materials, equipment and supplies required for completion and implementation of technical projects.
- Analyzes, evaluates, and plans method of approach and organizes means to achieve the solution of problems in the mining operations environment and recommends necessary corrections in technical analyses and design to ensure successful project completion or ongoing mining operations.

Requires Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor Degree in Engineering, Mining specialty).



MINING ENGINEER C - POSITION CODE 4724 (NEW)

Fully Competent Level. Full technical responsibility for planning, organizing, and conducting technical mining plans, specifications and reports requiring familiarity with a broad range of engineering methods and techniques with particular emphasis on mining engineering. Duties may include:

- Conducts studies of ore, mineral or coal deposits in order to assess the feasibility of mining operations.
- Conducts independent investigation involving the original application of the principles of engineering in the development of surface of subsurface mines.
- Prepares design specifications, analyses, and recommendations for presentation and approval on aspects of underground or surface mine design or construction, mine exploration, extraction and processing.

Requires Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor Degree in Engineering, Mining specialty; Eligibility for P.Eng.).

MINING ENGINEER B - POSITION CODE 4725 (NEW)

Intermediate Level. Design and development or design modification, using a variety of standard engineering methods and techniques with particular emphasis on mining engineering. Duties may include:

- Works in the design and testing of a component of a larger design project preparing mining plans, designs, calculations, design specifications, costs and bills of material, catalogues, in accordance with established codes, standards, drawings or other mining specifications.
- Wide range of mine planning and development activities, economic evaluation, productivity analysis, mine design, mine planning.
- Responsible for routine technical mining decisions within established guidelines.

Requires Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor Degree in Engineering, Mining specialty; Eligibility for P.Eng.).

MINING ENGINEER A - POSITION CODE 4726 (NEW)

Developmental Level. Mining Engineer in Training performing a variety of tasks involving the application of basic mining engineering/scientific principles to assigned problems. Duties may include:

- Prepares simple basic mining plans, designs, calculations, design specifications, costs and bills of material, catalogues, in accordance with established codes, standards, drawings or other mining specifications.
- Prepares reports, charts, graphs, and other documents and makes recommendations to senior staff. Interface with tailings planning engineers, geotechnical engineers, and geologists.
- Help to develop mine plans and schedules/forecasts, integrate work with other mining group functions.
- Assist in development of specifications, evaluation, and selection of mining equipment.
- Responsible for routine technical mining decisions within clearly defined procedures or precedents.
- Requires Undergraduate Degree (Bachelor Degree in Engineering, Mining specialty; Eligibility for P.Eng.).

TECHNICAL SERVICES

MANAGER TECHNICAL SERVICES - POSITION CODE 4410

Responsible for providing competent technical field service support, and liaising with the maintenance staff, engineers, and site management. Duties may include:

- Assisting in the installation and servicing of major mechanical/ electronic equipment, eggs, generators, turbines, compressors and control equipment at varied sites.
- Establishing and maintaining plant and equipment, resolve technical problems and ensure quality and safety.

- Develops or directs the set-up of test equipment and the conduct of appropriate tests on new, prototype or experimental units.
- May work with customer services and interface with clients in troubleshooting equipment or product problems.
